A little bit about us...

The 4th Precinct of the St. Louis County Police hosted a fishing tournament annually, which they were on the verge of discontinuing due to the workload and decline in participation. Local 110 President Rob Reed, who had previously fished the tournament, approached the Executive Board and the Membership of Local 110 with the idea for Local 110 to host the fishing tournament. In its inaugural year, it raised over \$20,000 compared to the \$5,000 which was raised the year before.

Each year, the tournament chooses an additional non-profit to receive 10% of the proceeds. For the third annual tournament, we have chosen the Veterans Community Project located in St. Louis. The VCP Village is a specialized community of 50 tiny homes with on-site, wraparound support services designed to equip Veterans with the tools needed to return to a stable, prosperous, independent life. Each tiny house provides everything a Veteran needs to live with dignity and security; new furniture, appliances, housewares, bedding, personal items, and utilities - all free of charge. The homes offer sanctuary and the emotional space needed for each Veteran and VCP's specially-trained team to thoroughly address the underlying causes of his or her homelessness. Here, Veterans work to achieve incremental, lasting results in the areas of health and wellness, income stability, education and training, fiscal understanding, and the development of a personal support network. Once the Veteran's individual goals are met, VCP assists him or her in securing a permanent housing solution and transitioning to a new life. These funds are used to assist officers with recovery from injury/illness, hold events for fallen officers and fund collegiate scholarships.

- 1. **Eligibility** All individuals, 18 years of age or older, with a paid entry fee are eligible to fish. A parent or legal guardian must accompany anyone under 18 years of age. The Tournament Director reserves the right to reject any entry that is not in the best interest of the tournament.
- 2. Entry Fee Entry fee is \$120.00 per team, including one (1) Big Bass prize. Entry fees will be accepted by mail until September 1st, 2021 or may be paid at the ramp prior to take off (\$150 CASH ONLY AT RAMP). No refunds. Boat numbers will be assigned in the order of entries received.
- 3. Big Bass Angler chooses 1 fish to be weighed. The heaviest bass weighed in will receive a \$500 value prize (May be cash or gift card).
- **4. Payouts** 1st \$1200, 2nd \$1000, 3rd \$800. Subsequent places will be paid out with every 10 boat entries above 30. Lowest weight for five (5) fish limit will pay \$250. Heaviest 'Trash Fish' will pay \$250. (Local & State regulations apply).
- 5. Check-in & Pre-Meeting One (1) team member must check in the morning of the tournament or at the dinner the night before. Teams will receive their assigned boat number upon check in. Boats will be released in order after live well checks the morning of the tournament. You must return your boat number to the Tournament Director at weigh-in or upon early departure.
- 6. Scoring Largemouth, smallmouth and Kentucky (spotted) bass will be scored. All fish must be fifteen (15) inches in length and will be subject to measurement at weigh-in. There will be a five (5) fish limit. Short fish will result in a one (1) pound penalty and loss of fish. A dead fish will result in a one (1) pound penalty per dead fish. If dead fish is big bass, one (1) pound will be deducted from big bass. No more than five (5) fish are allowed in a boat's live wells at any time. Culling must be done prior to presenting the fish for weigh-in.
- 7. Safety and Sportsmanship Safe boating must be observed at all times. Use of life jackets and kill switches are recommended anytime the combustion motor is running. All contestants are required to follow the highest degree of sportsmanship, courtesy and conservation. In the event the tournament is cancelled due to unsafe weather or water conditions, all tournament entries will be refunded.
- 8. **Protest** All protests must be submitted in writing to the Tournament Director within fifteen (15) minutes of the weigh-in completion. The decision of the Tournament Director will be final in all matters.
- 9. Late Penalty One (1) pound per minute, up to ten (10) minutes, then disqualification. YOUR BOAT NUMBER MUST BE TURNED IN BY THE END OF THE TOURNAMENT HOURS TO AVOID LATE PENALTY. Tournament officials will be at the end of the dock collecting boat numbers approximately 30 minutes prior to end of the tournament hours.
- 10. Ties All ties will be broken by 1) Big bass 2) Most fish weighed in. 3) Earliest entry received.
- 11. Tackle and Equipment Only artificial lures and pork style baits are allowed. All bass must be caught on a rod and reel. Only one (1) rod and reel may be in use at anytime by any one (1) angler. No trolling.
- 12. Boats and Motors Any boat, 14 feet or longer, with a functional kill switch, bilge pump, and properly aerated live well(s) will be accepted.
- 13. Locations Anywhere on tournament waters available to the public and accessible by boat, except areas designated as "off limits" or "no fishing" by local, state, or federal officials. OTHER OFF LIMIT AREAS— within fifty (50) yards of another contestant's anchored boat, Public Beach #2 cove and the coves to the right and left of it, within 50 yards of any gas dock, and from 50 yards east of 5-65 Marina gas dock to the back of Red Oak cove will be off limits. All contestants are responsible for knowledge of the off-limits area and should ask the Tournament Director for any clarification needed.
- 14. Insurance Boat owners must have at least \$100,000 of Boating Liability insurance. Proof of insurance may be asked for at any time.
- 15. Special Situations 1) Breakdown In the event of a boat breakdown, the team may transfer their fish to another contestant's boat for transport to the weigh in site. The fish must be placed in a segregated live well. One (1) member of the broken-down team must accompany the fish to the weigh in site. The broken-down team must stop fishing from the time of transfer. 2) Early departure Any team departing prior to weigh-in from the tournament water must contact the Tournament Director. Failure to do so will result in the loss of any money earned at the tournament. 3) Cell Phones All contestants are encouraged to have cell phones in their boat for emergency use. Contestants may not depart the boat to land fish or make the boat more accessible to fishing waters. Contestants must leave and return to take off/weigh in by boat. Trailering of boats is not permitted during tournament hours.
- **16. Knowledge of these rules is the responsibility of each contestant** Failure to read these rules or ignorance of them is no excuse. Any announcements made by the Tournament Director at the tournament site will take precedent over the written rules. The decision of the Tournament Director shall be final in all matters. Contestants are reminded that the primary goals of this tournament are to have fun and raise funds for a great organization.
- 17. Waiver By signing this entry form you release LiUNA Local 110, St. Louis County Police, Red Oak Resort and any other affiliates of this tournament from any liabilities.
